Open science is important to us and the ARPHA platform allows for easy and automatic dissemination of biodiversity data to various databases. In this way, we contribute to making scientific research and biodiversity data freely available to all.

You will be glad to hear that despite this major upgrade, our core values remain the same. *Plant Ecology and Evolution* remains a diamond open access journal, so there are no article processing fees and all papers are free to read. Our scope and our standard for high-quality research also remain unchanged.
